

CHIMA Code of Ethics Interpretation Guidelines

Code of Ethics and the Public

In relation to the public, the health information management professional shall:

- 1. Recognize that health care delivery requires cooperation and communication between agencies. (Codes 1, 4 and 5)
- 2. Support health care delivery through the preservation and appropriate access and disclosure of information across the continuum of care. (Codes 1 and 2)
- 3. Respect and protect the confidentiality and privacy of health information. (Codes 2 and 3)

Code of Ethics and Health Care Providers

In the relationship with care providers, the health information management professional shall:

- 1. Respect the Code of Ethics of other professionals as they relate to the privacy and confidentiality of personal health information. (Codes 2, 5 and 10)
- 2. Assist health care providers in the provision of services related to care delivery, education, and research. (Codes 1, 3, 4, and 5)

- 3. Disclose to no one, except for the proper authorities, any identified or suspected professional misconduct or violation of organizational policy. (Codes 2, 3 and 5)
- 4. Ensure that the integrity of health information is not compromised. (Codes 1, 2 and 9)

Code of Ethics and Other Service Providers

In the relationship with other service providers, the health information management professional shall:

- 1. Assist service providers in their roles supporting the health system. (Codes 1, 3, 4 and 5)
- 2. Disclose to no one, except for the proper authorities, any identified or suspected professional misconduct or violation of organizational policy. (Codes 2, 3 and 5)

Code of Ethics and the Employer

In the relationship with an employer, the health information management professional shall:

- 1. Fulfill all responsibilities with integrity and discretion. (All codes)
- 2. Respect the role of the organization in the health care delivery system. (Codes 1, 4 and 9)
- 3. Respect and acknowledge the role of all participants in the organization. (Codes 4 and 9)

Code of Ethics and the Health Information Management Professional

Each member of the Canadian Health Information Management Association shall:

- 1. Appropriately represent the profession to the public. (Codes 4 and 5)
- 2. Participate in developing and strengthening the profession through personal development. (Code 6)

- 3. Participate in developing and strengthening the profession through supporting our peers and others interested in health information management. (Code 9)
- 4. Strive to enrich the profession through participation in non-traditional HIM activities and sharing the knowledge gained. (Codes 6 and 7)
- 5. Safeguard the public and the profession by reporting to the Professional Conduct Committee any breach of this Code of Ethics by members of the profession.(Codes 5 and 8)

Code of Ethics and the Canadian College of Health Information Management

Each member of the Canadian Health Information Management Association shall:

- 1. Represent truthfully professional credentials, education and experience. (Codes 4, 5 and 8)
- 2. Discharge honourably the responsibilities of any association position to which appointed or elected. (Codes 4, 5 and 8)
